Our key messages on revision are:

- 1) Start revision **now** if you have not done so already. **You cannot leave revision until later.**
- 2) Be **active** when undertaking revision. Write, make notes, answer questions and do past papers as appropriate.
- 3) Simply sitting and reading notes or highlighting material is unlikely to be beneficial for most students.
