### Welcome

It is a great privilege to have been appointed as the new Headteacher of Sir Bernard Lovell Academy and I am very much looking forward to starting in September. I bring to the job over 15 years of school leadership experience, including 5 years in my current role as Senior Deputy Head at Hardenhuish School, a large 11-18 high performing academy in Chippenham.

Since my appointment in April, I have been working closely with Mr Anderson and other members of the Senior Leadership Team to ensure a smooth handover so that SBL continues to go from strength to strength. As you are probably aware, Mr Anderson has secured a promotion to the role of Director of Secondary Education in the Futura Learning Partnership and so will continue to work closely with me as the new Headteacher, as well as the other five Futura secondary schools. I would like to honour the great work that Mr Anderson has done during his 6 years as Principal of SBL. I like the well known mantra of the New Zealand All Blacks rugby team of 'leaving the jersey in a better place'. This captures the All Blacks commitment to enhancing the reputation of the team for as long as they wear the shirt and leaving it in a better place for the players that follow them. This is certainly the case for Mr Anderson who leaves the school in a very good place having achieved his vision to make SBL the school of choice for the local community. Our bumper intake for 2023/24 is evidence of this with about 260 new Year 7 students joining us in September.

Talking of which, it was a joy to welcome our new Year 7 students during their induction day on Tuesday 4 July. They enjoyed a busy programme of taster lessons, time with their tutor and an assembly with me at the end of the day. It was also a pleasure to meet the parents and carers of the new Year 7 pupils at the induction evening and start to build the all important threeway partnership between home, school

and student. Earlier in the month, I very much enjoyed greeting our large intake of new Year 12 students on their induction days. One of the themes of their programme which I spoke about in my talk to the students



was about seizing opportunities which provide experiences for personal growth and development. Our Sixth Form at SBL is committed to providing a broad range of opportunities for our young people which open doors for their future success.

During my other visits to SBL over the last term, I have been struck by the positive, purposeful and orderly environment in the school. I am very grateful for the warm welcome that existing students have given me in the corridors and the courtesy they have shown through little things, such as holding doors open for others. I know that come September our current students will help to demonstrate to those new to the school the high standards we expect at SBL. We will also be calling on our students to help showcase our wonderful school at the open evening for Year 6 pupils and parents/carers on 5 October 2023 as well as during the open mornings which run from 27 September to 11 October.

In the meantime and as Term 6 draws to a close, I would like to wish everyone in the SBL community a restful and enjoyable summer holiday.



## MediSoc @ SBL 2022-23

Well done to all those who were a part of MedSoc this year!

We had 15 MedSoc sessions during this first year of MedSoc@SBL, of which 5 sessions were with invited guests that included Dr Sophie Kenyon (Doctor of Obstetrics and gynaecology), Junaid Hameed (5th year medical student at Oxford University), Lavinia (Head Nurse), Lisa Pullen (Palliative Nurse) and one face to face session with Sally Darby (Dietician at BRI). The other sessions covered topics including medical ethics and getting into Med School.

The past few sessions of MedSoc were run exclusively for KS3 students as the KS4 were busy with their exams. We held the 'Step into NHS competition session' where the students researched the various opportunities on the 'STEP into NHS website' and took part in an online quiz on what job suits them best. They are currently working on their competition entry — a poster advertising an NHS job they have researched and are interested in.

MedSoc also had its first invited guest/visitor, Sally Darby, who is working as a dietician in NHS. This session was very interactive with students asking lots of questions on how the diet of patients with neurological disability is managed by the NHS.
