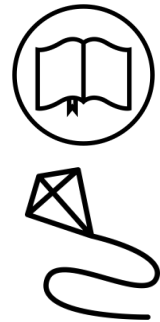


A Level English Language and Literature

Why study English Language and Literature at A Level?

English Language and Literature is a great subject choice for students who enjoy both examining texts but also reading and enjoying literature. The course will allow you to read a wealth of different fiction and non-fiction alongside developing your understanding and analysis of the English language. The course joins the two different elements of English study together offering students a breadth of knowledge and understanding.



What will I study?

Throughout the course, you will study a wide range of skills and topics including:

- Contemporary fiction
- An anthology of poetry
- Study of a play
- Analysis of a collection of non-fiction texts
- Recasting and creative writing
- Coursework research project looking at one or more of your favourite works of fiction and non-fiction

Study trips, visits and events:

- Visit to Bristol library
- Opportunities to watch live theatre productions of your studied texts

Subject entry requirements:

- 5 or more GCSEs at grade 4
- A grade 5 or above in either English Language or Literature GCSE
