Why study Law at A Level?

Law plays a vital and wide-ranging role in society from protecting the public and regulating relationships, to the construction of agreements and the resolution of disputes.

A Level Law develops your ability to think deeply and critically about a wide range of topics. It teaches you how to write clearly, debate points of view from all sides and defend your own views. Law is for anybody with an interest in how our legal system works, and not just for those who may want a career in law.

What will I study?

You will study the relationship of law with morality, society and justice, and explore concepts such as the rule of law and parliamentary sovereignty. You will explore the appeal courts and key legal institutions such as the civil and criminal court hierarchy.

You will also explore criminal legal theory and offences against people and property, as well as human rights and Tort law.
